**What is this document?** This document explains what kind of study we're doing, what your rights are, and what will be done with your data. You should print this page for your records.

**Nature of the study.** You are invited to participate in a study about people's ability to learn Korean through Korean media like K-Pop and K-Drama. You do not need to have ever watched K-Drama or K-Pop to take part. In the study we will assess your knowledge of Korean and your ability to mimic Korean words, and also ask you some questions about your demographic background and exposure to Korean media. As part of this, we will ask you to listen to some audio files, and also ask you to record yourself producing Korean words, so you need to have access to audio and a microphone. Your responses will be recorded. Your session should last for up to 15 minutes. You will be given full instructions shortly.

**Risks and benefits.** There are no known risks to participation in this study. The main benefit to you is that we will give you feedback on your knowledge of Korean sounds. In addition, you will be contributing to our knowledge about how humans learn language, and the role of media exposure in this.

**Confidentiality and use of data.** All the information we collect during the course of the research will be processed in accordance with Data Protection Law. In order to safeguard your privacy, we will not collect personal information (like names or dates of birth). Because we are using voice recordings, we will be collecting data from which you could potentially be identified (e.g., by the sound of your voice), and so we will store this on secure University of Edinburgh servers. All data collected during this study will be used for research purposes.

**What are my data protection rights?** The University of Edinburgh is a Data Controller for the information you provide. You have the right to access information held about you. Your right of access can be exercised in accordance Data Protection Law. You also have other rights including rights of correction, erasure and objection.
